## AEOI & GDPR | Access to Internal EU documents – Overriding Public Interest (2)

I refer to our Access to Documents Request (together with its timeline and the follow-up letter on overriding public interest).

On the issue of overriding public interest to a comprehensive and unedited access to internal EU documents, this article in *Euractiv*, confirms the very public, and growing, concern for the lack of action from EU institutions in relation to international data transfers.

In relation to international data transfers, the lack of action was first highlighted in a formal resolution from the European Parliament that meted out criticism towards the Commission, but also the EDPB. This was in 2018.

Further criticism was set out in the European Parliament's updated study on FATCA. This was in 2022.

In 2021, the Commission itself acknowledged that "FATCA is a long-standing issue, touching many areas, including data protection."

The latest criticism stemming from recent action by the new US administration merely reinforces an existing picture.

Accordingly, the applicants have demonstrated the requirements for unfettered and unedited access to documents under the ATD Regulation (EC) 1049/2011.
